Welcome! Today the Christian Church sings its praise to God for the mystery of the Word who became flesh, the incarnate God, Jesus Christ. Our Savior Jesus Christ is both true God and true man, the Son of God and the Son of Mary. We celebrate this great mystery, recognizing that Jesus' birth into this world was the first step on the road to the cross, by which he paid for our sins and earned our salvation and redemption.

Today is Christmas Day. During the Christmas season, the Church focuses on the salvation of mankind who came in human flesh. The white paraments are used to signify the Godhead, eternity, perfection, joy and purity.

### C: Amen.




## "Angels We Have Heard on High"

C: Amen.


FIRST LESSON Isaiah 52:7-10

<sup>7</sup>How beautiful on the mountains are the feet of a herald, who proclaims peace and preaches good news, who proclaims salvation, who says to Zion, "Your God is king!" <sup>8</sup> The voice of your watchmen—they lift up their voices. Together they shout for joy, because with both eyes they will see it when the LORD returns to Zion. <sup>9</sup> Break out, shout for joy together, you ruins of Jerusalem, because the LORD is comforting his people. 

SECOND LESSON Hebrews 1:1-9

1 In the past, God spoke to our forefathers by the prophets at many times and in many ways. <sup>2</sup> In these last days, he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom he made the universe. <sup>3</sup> The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact imprint of the divine nature. He sustains all things by his powerful word. After he had provided purification for sins, he took his seat at the right hand of the Majesty on high. <sup>4</sup> The Son became as much superior to the angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs. <sup>5</sup> For to which of the angels did God ever say: You are my Son. Today I have begotten you? And again: I will be his Father, and he will be my Son. <sup>6</sup> And again, when he brought his firstborn into the world, he said: Let all God's angels worship him. <sup>7</sup> About the angels he says: He makes his messengers winds and his ministers flaming fire. <sup>8</sup> But about the Son he says: God, your throne is forever and ever, and the scepter of righteousness is the scepter of your kingdom. <sup>9</sup> You have loved righteousness and hated wickedness. Therefore God, your God, has anointed you with the oil of joy beyond your companions. (EVV)



GOSPEL John 1:1-14

1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. <sup>2</sup> He was with God in the beginning. <sup>3</sup> Through him everything was made, and without him not one thing was made that has been made. <sup>4</sup> In him was life, and the life was the light of mankind. <sup>5</sup> The light is shining in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. <sup>6</sup> There was a man, sent from God, whose name was John. <sup>7</sup> He came as an eyewitness to testify about the light so that everyone would believe through him. <sup>8</sup> He was not the light, but he came to testify about the light. <sup>9</sup> The real light that shines on everyone was coming into the world. <sup>10</sup> He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not recognize him. <sup>11</sup> He came to what was his own, yet his own people did not accept him. <sup>12</sup> But to all who did receive him, to those who believe in his name, he gave the right to become children of God. <sup>13</sup> They were born, not of blood, or of the desire of the flesh, or of a husband's will, but born of God. <sup>14</sup> The Word became flesh and dwelled among us. We have seen his glory, the glory he has as the only-begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth.





CONFESSION OF FAITH Exerpts from the Athanasian Creed

It is necessary for eternal salvation truly to believe that our Lord Jesus Christ also took on human flesh. Now, that is the true Christian faith.

We believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ,

God's Son, is both God and man.

He is God, eternally begotten from the nature of the Father, and he is man, born in time from the nature of his mother, fully God, fully man, with rational soul and human flesh, equal to the Father as to his deity, less than the

Father as to his humanity;

And though he is both God and man, Christ is not two persons, but one,

One, not by changing the deity into flesh, but by taking the humanity into God;

One, indeed, not by mixture of the natures, but by unity in one person;

For just as the rational soul and flesh are one human being,

So God and man are one Christ.

He suffered for our salvation, descended into hell, rose the third day from the dead.

He ascended into heaven, is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty, And from there will come to judge the living and the dead.

This is the true Christian faith.

Whoever does not faithfully and firmly believe this cannot be saved.
