
- P: The grace of our Lord (*) Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you.

First Lesson 1 Kings 19:3-8

³ Elijah was afraid, and he ran for his life. He went to Beersheba, which belongs to Judah, and he left his servant there. ⁴ But he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness. There he sat down under a broom tree, where he prayed that he would die. He said, "I've had enough, LORD. Take my life, for I am no better than my fathers." ⁵ Then he lay down and went to sleep under the broom tree. Suddenly an angel touched him and said, "Get up and eat." ⁶ Then he looked around, and near his head there was a loaf of bread baking on coals and a jar of water, so he ate and drank, and then he lay down again. ⁷ Then the angel of the LORD came back a second time and touched him and said, "Get up and eat, because the journey is too much for you." ⁸ So he got up and ate and drank. Then, with the strength gained from that food, he walked for forty days and forty nights to Horeb, the mountain of God. (EHV)


Second Lesson Hebrews 5:11-6:3

¹¹ We have much to say about this, and it is difficult to explain, because you have become too lazy to listen. ¹² In fact, though by this time you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you the beginning principles of God's word all over again. You have become people who need milk, not solid food. ¹³ For everyone who lives on milk is not acquainted with the word of righteousness, because he is still an infant. ¹⁴ But solid food is for mature people, who have their senses trained by practice to distinguish between good and evil. **6** Therefore, leaving the beginning discussion of Christ, let us press on toward matters that require greater maturity, not laying again the foundation of repentance from dead works, of faith in God, ² of the teaching about baptisms, of the laying on of hands, of the resurrection of the dead, and of eternal judgment. ³ And we will do this, if God permits. (EHV)
