Eighteenth Sunday after Pentecost

September 18 & 22, 2024

WELCOME TO ZION. It is our hope and prayer that the message you hear today from God's Word will strengthen your faith and fill your heart with the peace only God can give and the joy we have in believing that JESUS CHRIST is our Savior from sin.

Worship Focus: What will that person be like, who follows Jesus in this life, who takes up his own cross after the one who bore it for us and for our salvation? He will be like the one he follows, first inwardly and then outwardly. Neither the internal attitudes nor the outward behavior is natural to any of us. At the same time, those attitudes and that behavior are expected of a follower of Jesus. Only closeness to his cross and nearness to him in the Word and sacraments make us such as follow him; and only the grace and pardon that ever flows from that cross in the means of grace save us from the wrath to come on those who do not follow him.

This is the Eighteenth Sunday after Pentecost. In this season, we have now entered fully into the Half Year of the Church. We never leave behind Christ and his work for us which was the center of our attention in the Half Year of Our Lord (Advent-the Festival of Pentecost); but now the emphasis will shift to the result of his work through the Word.




THE GATHERING RITE ON THE WORD



- P: In the name of the Father and of the Son 🕏 and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: (spoken) Amen.

- C: sweeter than honey to my mouth!




- P: All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness,

- P: Yet so often we have despised God's Word and failed to gladly hear and learn it. For this and all our sins, we bow before God and humbly ask his forgiveness.
- C: Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words, and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.



- P: God gave his Word so "that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name" (John 20:31). The Scriptures testify about Jesus, who lived a perfect life for you, died on the cross to pay for all your sins, and rose again to assure you of your salvation. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.




THE WORD




In you, O LORD, I have taken <u>ref</u>uge;* deliver me in your <u>right</u>eousness.

Second Lesson: James 3:13-18

¹³ Who among you is wise and intelligent? Let him by his good way of living show that he does things in wise humility. ¹⁴ But if you have bitter envy and selfish ambition in your heart, do not boast and lie, contrary to the truth. ¹⁵ This is not the wisdom that comes down from above, but it is worldly, unspiritual, and demonic. ¹⁶ In fact, where there is envy and selfish ambition, there will also be disorder and every bad practice. ¹⁷ But the wisdom that comes from above is first pure, then also peaceful, gentle, reasonable, full of mercy and good fruits, impartial, and sincere. ¹⁸ And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace by those who practice peace. (EHV)

GOSPEL: Mark 9:30-37

³⁰ They went on from there and passed through Galilee. He did not want anyone to know this, ³¹ because he was teaching his disciples. He told them, "The Son of Man is going to be betrayed into the hands of men, and they will kill him. But three days after he is killed, he will rise." ³² But they did not understand the statement and

were afraid to ask him about it. ³³ They came to Capernaum. When he was in the house, he asked them, "What were you arguing about on the way?" ³⁴ But they remained silent, because on the way they had argued with one another about who was the greatest. ³⁵ Jesus sat down, called the Twelve, and said to them, "If anyone wants to be first, he will be the last of all and the servant of all." ³⁶ Then he took a little child and placed him in their midst. Taking the child in his arms, he said to them, ³⁷ "Whoever welcomes one of these little children in my name welcomes me. And whoever welcomes me, welcomes not just me but also him who sent me."
