WELCOME TO ZION. It is our hope and prayer that the message you hear today from God's Word will strengthen your faith and fill your heart with the peace only God can give and the joy we have in believing that JESUS CHRIST is our Savior from sin.

Today is Christmas Eve Day. During the Christmas season, the Church focuses on the salvation of mankind who came in human flesh. The white paraments are used to signify the Godhead, eternity, perfection, joy and purity.

But, he also promises that if we confess our sins, God who is faithful and just, will forgive our sins and cleanse us from unrighteousness. Trusting this promise, we confess our sins to God our Father.

Congregation: Merciful Father, we confess to you that we are sinful in both who we are and how we live. Instead of trusting your promises and obeying your will, we have lived to follow our own desires and seek the approval of people. We have not loved others as you have called us to do, but used them for our own personal gain. We deserve your just punishment. For the sake of Jesus Christ, who was born to die and rise for our salvation, have mercy upon us and forgive us our sins.

(Please take a moment of silence to confess your sins to God.)



FIRST LESSON

Isaiah 9:2-7

² The people walking in darkness have seen a great light. For those living in the land of the shadow of death, the light has dawned. ³ You have multiplied the nation. You have increased its joy. They rejoice before you like the joy at harvest time, like the celebration when people divide the plunder. ⁴ For you have shattered the yoke that burdened them. You have broken the bar on their shoulders and the rod of their oppressor, as you did in the day of Midian. ⁵ Every boot that marched in battle and the garments rolled in blood will be burned. They will be fuel for the fire. ⁶ For to us a child is born. To us a son is given. The authority to rule will rest on his shoulders. GOSPEL

Luke 2:1-20

2 In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. ²This was the first census taken while Quirinius was governing Syria. ³And everyone went to register, each to his own town. ⁴ And Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the town of Nazareth, into Judea, to the town of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was from the house and family line of David. ⁵He went to be registered with Mary, his wife, who was pledged to him in marriage and was expecting a child. ⁶ And so it was that while they were there, the time came for her to give birth. ⁷ And she gave birth to her firstborn son, wrapped him in swaddling cloths, and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn. ⁸ There were in the same country shepherds staying out in the fields, keeping watch over their flock at night. ⁹An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified! ¹⁰ But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. For behold, I bring you good news of great joy, which will be for all people: ¹¹ Today in the town of David, a Savior was born for you. He is Christ the Lord. ¹² And this will be a sign for you: You will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in manger." ¹³ Suddenly, there was with the angel a multitude from the heavenly army, praising God and saying, ¹⁴ "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward mankind." ¹⁵ When the angels went away from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Now let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened,


which the Lord has made known to us." ¹⁶ So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. ¹⁷ When they had seen him, they told others the message they had been told about this child. ¹⁸ And all who heard it were amazed by what the shepherds said to them. ¹⁹ But Mary treasured up all these things, pondering them in her heart. ²⁰ And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things that they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told. Congregation: His gospel is peace! Amen!


