**WELCOME TO ZION**. It is our hope and prayer that the message you hear today from God's Word will strengthen your faith and fill your heart with the peace only God can give and the joy we have in believing that JESUS CHRIST is our Savior from sin.

Worship Focus: Christ feeds us with himself and gives himself to us in the gospel. On this Sunday, as the Gospel lessons from John 6 come to a close, the living and life-giving bread from heaven sums them all up and calls us to one more great work: to use the strength he gives in the saving food for faithful confession to the truth of his Word. If our own sinful flesh is never converted and remains hostile to both the law and the gospel, it should not surprise us that the world is hostile to all of the gospel and much of the law as well. May our confession of loyalty to all of his Word show that we live in and on Christ, the divine and saving food!

This is the Fourteenth Sunday after Pentecost. In this season, we have now entered fully into the Half Year of the Church. We never leave behind Christ and his work for us which was the center of our attention in the Half Year of Our Lord (Advent-the Festival of Pentecost); but now the emphasis will shift to the result of his work through the Word.


### THE WORD

### FIRST LESSON Joshua 24:1-2a, 14-18

24 Then Joshua gathered all the tribes of Israel at Shechem, and he summoned the elders of Israel, its heads, its judges, and its officers, and they presented themselves before God. <sup>2</sup> Then Joshua told all the people, "This is what the LORD, the God of Israel, has said."

<sup>14</sup> Joshua said, "Now, therefore, fear the LORD and serve him wholeheartedly and faithfully. Remove the gods that your fathers served in the region across the River and in Egypt, and serve the LORD. <sup>15</sup> But if you see no benefit in serving the LORD, then choose for yourselves today whomever you will serve—whether the gods that your fathers served beyond the River or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land you are living. But as for me and my household—we will serve the LORD!" <sup>16</sup> The people responded by saying, "Far be it from us to forsake the LORD in order to serve other gods! <sup>17</sup> For the LORD our God, he is the one who brought us and our ancestors up from the land of Egypt, where we were slaves. He is the one who performed these great signs right before our eyes and protected us on the whole journey that we made and among all the peoples through whom we passed. <sup>18</sup> The LORD drove out of our presence all the peoples and the Amorites who were living in the land. We too will serve the LORD, because he is our God!" (EHV)

Second Lesson Hebrews 11:24-28


<sup>24</sup> By faith Moses refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter when he grew up. <sup>25</sup> He chose to be mistreated with God's people rather than enjoy sin for a little while. <sup>26</sup> He considered disgrace for the sake of Christ as greater wealth than the treasures of Egypt, because he was looking ahead to his reward.

<sup>27</sup> By faith he left Egypt without fearing the king's wrath, because he persevered as one who sees him who is invisible. <sup>28</sup> By faith he celebrated the Passover and the sprinkling of blood, so that the destroyer of the firstborn would not strike them down. (EHV)

Who can listen to it?" <sup>61</sup> But Jesus, knowing in himself that his disciples were grumbling about this, asked them, "Does this cause you to stumble in your faith? <sup>62</sup> What if you would see the Son of Man ascending to where he was before? <sup>63</sup> The Spirit is the one who gives life. The flesh does not help at all. The words that I have spoken to you are spirit and they are life. <sup>64</sup> But there are some of you who do not believe." For Jesus knew from the beginning those who would not believe and the one who would betray him. <sup>65</sup> He said, "This is why I told you that no one can come to me unless it is given to him by my Father." <sup>66</sup> After this, many of his disciples turned back and were not walking with him anymore. <sup>67</sup> So Jesus asked the Twelve, "You do not want to leave too, do you?" <sup>68</sup> Simon Peter answered him, "Lord, to whom will we go?
