WELCOME TO ZION. It is our hope and prayer that the message you hear today from God's Word will strengthen your faith and fill your heart with the peace only God can give and the joy we have in believing that JESUS CHRIST is our Savior from sin.

Worship Focus: The liturgical year ends with a grand confession of faith and a hymn of adoration to Christ the King. In each of the readings different aspects of his majesty finds emphasis. They are all held together by the golden thread of the unique nature of that majesty. Never was there or could there be another king like him; beyond all comparison is the rule he exercises in time and in eternity. Incomparably great therefore is also our joy in worshipping him even now, as we await his triumphant return to transform our worship in faith and under the cross to worship in sight and glory.

This is the Last Sunday in the season of End Time. During these four Sundays, the Church focuses on the fulfillment of Christ's promises and encouragement for the Church. We live in the last days and in this season, Jesus wants us to remember his promise, "behold, I am coming soon!" The white paraments for the last two Sundays of the season of End Time are used to remind us of the color of the robe of the glorified King, and of the angels and saints in heaven. It is the color of perfection, joy and purity, which all Christians will enjoy in the heavenly kingdom.

OUR FAMILY AT WORSHIP


BATHROOMS While we are in the construction phase, the bathrooms that are functional are located in the East Foyer or down in the school hallway. Please ask an usher for help finding them.


PRAYER OF THE DAY
