DECEMBER 2024 John 10:9 "I am the door. Whoever enters through me will be saved. He will come in and go out, and find pasture."

From the Pastor



As we've been looking at Jesus' "I AM" statements in John's Gospel, our focus has been on how God says "I love you" with each description and how he helps you. Through all of these remember that each time when God says 'I am," he wants you to know that he is the LORD who delivers from the bondage of sin and that he is the God who loves you.

How does God describe Himself to His creation? Here in John 10 he simply says: I am the door. I rarely sit around and ponder the existential reasons for doors. They're just there. We open them to go from one place to another. We walk through them when they're open. We shut them to have privacy. We lock them to keep our families safe. We paint them to keep them looking nice and to protect them from deteriorating. Doors are usually rectangle. If you're a Hobbit, they are circular.

How does a door further Jesus goal of teaching us and bringing us closer to him? First, a grammar note. There's a major difference between a definite article and an indefinite article. It's eternally important to understand that Jesus uses the definite article here. Jesus isn't a door: one of many, many options. He is THE door. You can try other doors, but they don't lead to anywhere good. He is the only one that matters eternally.

It matters eternally because of where this one door leads. Jesus uses the picture of the door in connection with sheep. Sheep need to be kept safe, so they are put in a pen. Sheep being in a pen are fine there until they need something. They will need to be fed and they will need to be cared for.

There is only one way for a human being to receive the nourishment and care that results in a person having a blessed future in heaven with God. It is to go through The Door. It is to learn from Jesus, to be fed by Jesus, to be cared for by Jesus. How does he do this? He does it through his Word. The entire Bible has one purpose: to reveal Jesus as the Word made flesh born to die and rise again in order to make us right with God.

From the beginning of Genesis, God shows how mankind broke his creation bringing death and decay, and then how God's pure grace and love led him to not punish Adam and Eve, but promise to undo what they had done by sending One born of woman who would crush that serpent's head. God promised Abraham that through his offspring all people would be blessed. God promised that a child of Judah would never have the scepter depart from him. God promised that he would establish the throne of the son of David forever. Through the prophets Isaiah, Jeremiah, Micah, Habakkuk, Malachi and others God made promises that the promised one to come would bring forgiveness, pardon, peace. He would be God himself and also true man.

God shows in the Gospels how Jesus came from the Father full of grace and truth; how he made heaven crash to earth by wrapping the fullness of God in the flesh of a helpless baby. He shows how he fulfilled every single promise God made in the Old Testament by being both our righteousness and our atoning payment for our sins.

Entering through The Door for us sheep is, simply, to believe in the Word made flesh.






